The front porch is a place of welcome and a place of gathering. But as I sit here, writing this article, I am praying for our church to grow in prayer in this season. But I am also simply thankful for this place I sit. I can think of all the times I have sat in this very place and enjoyed the presence of God. Sometimes it has been with friends or family. But often times it is alone. Me and my Creator. I'm thankful for this place I can come because I know He will always be there waiting. It doesn't have to be a conversation. Just to gaze upon the Lord and be loved by Him. This is where I'm filled. This is where I'm loved. It is a sacred space where I meet with God and He always is there to meet with me.

When I was growing up, I learned many ways to pray. There is the Lord's Prayer, a great place to start. Prayers of blessing for food, prayers for the sick, and prayers for life's troubles and challenges. But as I have grown in my relationship with the Lord, I have learned that prayer is more than a conversation with God. He has led me to grow to simply enjoy being with Him. Yet the news about him spread all the more, so that crowds of people came to hear him and to be healed of their sicknesses. But Jesus often withdrew to lonely places and prayed. (Luke 5:15 - 16 NIV)

As the ministry of Jesus spread, many came to him for teaching and for healing. I'm certain his everyday routine was rapidly changing. There was more to do, more time spent and busyness doing work the world had yet to see. Can you imagine being there in that time? Can you imagine what it might have been like for Jesus and the disciples as more and more people came to hear these teachings and experience all they had heard? How easy it must have been to fill the time in a day with all this miraculous work of Jesus of Nazareth. BUT Jesus often withdrew to lonely places and prayed. The word for "lonely" used here can be translated as the wilderness, the desert, a solitary place where one is all alone.

The text could have said, *But Jesus often withdrew to pray* but it doesn't. It gives us an incredible piece of advice for our walks in prayer with God. Jesus knew that to be with His Father, he had to leave the busy and GO OFF somewhere. He had to retreat from the whirlwind to be with his Father. Where is that place for you? Find it regularly. Abide in His Presence. I heard this quote the other day and I believe it is a paraphrase of Psalm 27:13 and I love it as an encouragement to us all. "May you find the goodness of God in actual life. May you find the lonely place only to find that you are not at all alone."
