


Finding Water Beyond the Rock

When I first arrived on the mission field in Honduras, I visited remote villages where I witnessed children suffering from malnutrition caused by intestinal parasites contracted from dirty water. I saw women and girls making long journeys to fetch water. Witnessing these hardships ignited a commitment within me to find ways to provide clean water to people so that they could live with the dignity that God intended for them.

Forty years ago, I drilled my first water well in Honduras. Since that day, I have been involved in the drilling of over 300 clean water wells in Honduras, Nicaragua, Ethiopia, Guatemala, Kenya, and several others around the world. Currently, I oversee the



Drilling water wells is always a challenge. Each well presents unique conditions, and one never knows what to expect. The substrate beneath the ground can vary greatly, ranging from clay and gravel to soft rock, hard rock, and sand. Water is typically found in sand. An essential part of the drilling process is to analyze the cuttings brought to the surface by the drilling mud. This analysis tells us about the type of drill bit needed for each section and the likelihood of finding water. Despite the uncertainties, we maintain trust that water does exist; we just don't know how deep we must go or how challenging the drilling process might be.

Similarly, discerning God's will for our future can be challenging. We often cannot foresee what lies ahead or anticipate the outcomes of our decisions. However, we hold onto the belief that goodness awaits us. Jeremiah reminds us that the Lord declares, "I know the plans I have for you...plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future" (Jer 29:11). We trust God's promise but, at times, we have to admit that the path ahead may seem as impenetrable as hard rock.

During the process of drilling through hard rock, we can easily doubt our ability to find water. There are moments when progress seems minimal, and we wonder if we will ever break through the hard rock to water-bearing sand. Despite the discouragement, we persist, slowly but steadily, until we reach water. The apostle Paul teaches us that endurance fosters strength of character, and character fortifies our confident hope of salvation. This hope does not disappoint us (Rom 5:3-4). In life's toughest moments, it's easy to become disheartened and doubt our ability to succeed. Yet, as we endure, God shapes our character, strengthening our faith. We trust that just as in water well drilling, we will eventually find and enjoy refreshing water - the Living Water that Christ provides.
